ABOUT THE PROJECT

The main objective of the "Digitalization, Life is Your Creation" initiative is to empower the younger generation and encourage their active and conscientious participation as citizens in the digital realm. This is achieved through imparting essential digital literacy skills and advocating for responsible and ethical values. Intercultural learning, respect and understanding are promoted as part of the program, as well as a focus on raising awareness about the importance of being responsible online through improving digital literacy

The program also empowers young people with critical thinking skills to navigate the digital landscape. It seeks to promote the importance of managing digital footprints, preserving personal information online, stimulating thoughtful discussion on the ethical challenges associated with digital citizenship Furthermore, the project addresses the issue of cyberbullying, aimed at raising awareness among victims and witnesses.

This program increases empathy and understanding by engaging participants in the role played by the cyberbully and the victim, stimulating critical thinking in technology of users, and by advocating for digital security and responsible engineering practices. To achieve these goals, the project looks forward to providing an innovative approach to building supportive and positive online communities. It encourages participants to consider different perspectives and engage in dialogue on digital ethics, ultimately aiming to raise awareness about the importance of digital citizenship and the role individuals play in creating a safe and respectful digital environment.
